Curriculum testing, sustainable impact and global dissemination

In order to be able to disseminate the project results in a scientifically sound manner, at least two groups of at least 10 learners from each partner country will test the developed materials. These pilot tests, which will be led by trained VET trainers from C1, will take place in virtual and face-to-face sessions and will provide information on the effectiveness of our curriculum. Feedback from trainers and learners will be used to further refine and improve the programme.



The UglyFruitsNOT! Curriculum and Handbook empower VET trainers, professionals in the food supply industry, and consumers alike to play an active role in sustainable production and consumption. The validated training course ensures transferability across Europe and beyond. By translating the curriculum into all partner languages, we are fostering accessibility at both European and international levels.

The results of our project will be disseminated through a series of multiplier events, conducted locally and culminating in the Final Multiplier Event in Poland. These events will serve as platforms to showcase the training course and share the insights gained from pilot tests.
